1. INTRODUCTION

The freedom to use golf carts on City roads is a lifestyle benefit many Florida residents enjoy. When golf cart drivers share the public roads with automobiles, trucks, buses, bicycles and pedestrians, a high degree of care and knowledge in the operation of golf carts is essential. This Golf Cart Operator's Manual provides important guidance and instruction on golf cart operations and is a valuable tool to ensure the safety of golf cart drivers, pedestrians and other roadway users.

The City of Frostproof provides this material to assist you with the State, County and City rules applicable for the use of golf carts on these roads.

GOLF CART SAFETY

This Golf Cart Operator's Manual is intended to encourage the safe operation of golf carts for general transport in the City of Frostproof and in consonance with City Ordinance No. 2019-1 and Florida Law 316.212. This manual outlines the basic expectations of golf cart safety. With this intent, the City shall promote safe golf cart operations with reliance on the following:

1. Golf cart operators shall be 16 years of age or over.
2. Golf carts may not be used on sidewalks or trails.
3. The City shall develop appropriate literature advising safe operation of golf carts and this manual.
4. The City shall coordinate and encourage safe golf cart operation on approved City roads and across permitted County and State roadways.

DISCLAIMER

This Golf Cart Operator's Manual addresses the requirements of City Ordinance 2019-1 and Florida Statute 316.212. It offers safety advice not covered in the laws. However, this Manual should not be considered a legal reference. The Golf Cart Operator's Manual may be periodically revised. Just as safe golf cart operation is the sole responsibility of the golf cart owner/operator, the golf cart owner/operator is solely responsible for knowing and complying with all pertinent rules and regulations (as amended) on the use of golf carts in the City of Frostproof.

DRIVING IS A PRIVILEGE

The State of Florida considers the operation of a motor vehicle a privilege, not a right. One must not abuse the privilege or else risk losing it. The extension by the State of Florida to the operation of golf carts away from the golf course is likewise a privilege, and golf cart users in the City of Frostproof are challenged to protect that privilege and to avoid concerns that might result in the loss of this privilege.

2. CERTIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL FINDINGS:

FLORIDA STATUTES, SECTION 316.212 (2024 Edition)

The City of Frostproof, Florida, in following Florida Statute 316.212, operation of golf carts on certain roadways, has procured the services of Infrastructure Consulting and Engineering (ICE), LLC, 5550 West Idlewild Avenue, Suite 115, Tampa, Florida 33634, Mr. Gerald Dabkowski, PE, Vice President, Municipal Services, for the review of all City, County and State roadways within the City limits of Frostproof, Florida, for the following conditions.

Mr. Dabkowski personally drove/observed every roadway within the City limits of Frostproof, Florida, with the following conclusions:

All of the City, County, and State roadways within the City limits of Frostproof, Florida, have been driven/observed by Gerald Dabkowski, PE, on April 18, 2025, for the opportunity to consider if golf carts may safely travel on or cross public roadways within Frostproof, Florida, City limits. The considering factors were observed on April 18, 2025 including lane widths, number of lanes, site distances, speeds of vehicles, posted speeds, lighting, volumes, geography and the character of motor vehicles using the roads.

This manual update is based both on the analysis done in 2018, as well as new field observations made by Gerald Dabkowski and the ICE team in April 2025.

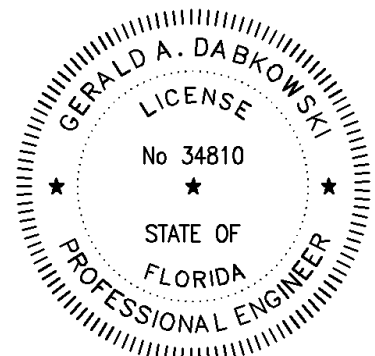
Based upon the engineer's findings of all roads in Frostproof, Florida, the safe operation of golf carts, as the established definition of a golf cart by the Florida Statutes, are safe vehicles to be used on City roads within the City limits of Frostproof Florida during daytime and nighttime periods utilizing the required apparatus attached to the golf cart per Florida Statutes, with the following exceptions.

EXCEPTIONS

The following roads are **NOT** appropriate for golf cart usage as of this report/date:

- a) State Road 17 within the City limits
- b) County Road 630 and 630 East within the City limits
- c) All roads posted above 25 miles per hour within the City limits

3. GOLF CART OPERATION FOR GENERAL TRANSPORT

A. CONDITIONS FOR GOLF CART OPERATION

For general transport purposes on City of Frostproof roads, in addition to the requirements of State and County laws, as well as common sense, the following conditions apply:

1. Golf cart operators shall carry a valid Drivers License issued by the State of Florida or similar responsible governmental agency.
2. Provide proof of vehicle ownership (bill of sale or affidavit of ownership)
3. That the golf cart has the following, operable equipment for dawn to dusk operation:
 - a) Efficient brakes, reliable steering, safe tires.
4. That the golf cart has the following, operable equipment for dusk to dawn operation:
 - a) Efficient brakes, reliable steering, safe tires, a windshield, red reflectorized warning devices in the front and rear, headlights, brake lights, turn signals.
5. Golf carts shall be restricted to operation on City roads that are specifically designated for golf cart operation.
6. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Polk County restricts golf cart operations on State and County roads except where specifically approved and signed by the appropriate agency.
7. Florida Statute 316.212 includes a provision allowing municipalities to designate sidewalks for golf cart operation under specific conditions. This authority was established to enhance safety by providing alternatives to standard vehicular traffic. With this provision, the City Council may choose to designate sidewalks for golf cart operation. Such a choice would be conditioned on a maximum golf cart speed of 15 MPH, a minimum sidewalk width of at least eight (8) feet, and appropriate signage. There are presently no sidewalks in the City that qualify for such designation.
8. For informational purposes only. Golf cart owners might mistakenly believe their homeowners insurance covers them in event of any accidental occurrence with their golf cart. Such coverage is generally only in force for "a golf cart owned by insured operator when using for golfing purposes". Use of a golf cart for general transport purposes, including shopping, doctor's appointments, banking and such, will usually necessitate a separate golf cart insurance policy for coverage. The absence of such coverage exposes the owner/operator to personal liability for property damage and bodily injury to others. Some insurance companies will write attachments to your homeowner's policy for an additional fee, but most will not, which will make it necessary that you purchase a separate policy for this needed protection. The policy should provide coverage for liability, property damage, and comprehensive coverage for damage to your own golf cart.

B. GOLF CART OPERATING ZONES

At this time, the City has defined two zones for general transport using golf carts. A golf cart zone map illustrating the boundaries, excluded roads and allowed crossings for the Eastside and Westside golf cart zones are included in Appendix A of this document. The following narrative explains the boundaries, excluded roads and allowed crossings.

EASTSIDE GOLF CART ZONE

The Eastside golf cart zone is bounded by State Road 17 to the East City limits.

- There is no permitted crossing of County Road 630 E, at this time.
- The only permitted crossing of State Road 17 is along E. Wall Street.

WESTSIDE GOLF CART ZONE

The Westside golf cart zone is bounded by State Road 17 to the west City limits.

- The only permitted crossing of County Road 630 W is along N. Palm Avenue.
- The only permitted crossing of State Road 17 is along W. Wall Street.

REMEMBER: GOLF CART USAGE IS NOT PERMITTED ANYWHERE ON SIDEWALKS & TRAILS.

C. THE CITY OF FROSTPROOF AND FLORIDA LAW

Florida State laws provide that “A golf cart may be operated only upon... a municipal street that has been designated by a municipality for use by golf carts. (Florida Statute 316.212 & 316.2125). Prior to making such designation, the responsible local governmental entity must first determine that golf carts may safely travel on or across the public road or street, considering factors including speed, volume, and character of motor vehicle traffic using the road or street.” The City of Frostproof, Ordinance No. 2019-1 provides for golf cart operation on and across certain roads pursuant to Florida Law. In addition, under State law, golf carts are not required to be registered with the Division of Motor Vehicles or carry a license plate. Specific elements of Florida Law and their application in the City of Frostproof are summarized as follows:

1. **MOTOR VEHICLE:** A self-propelled vehicle not operated upon rails or guideway, but not including any bicycle, electric bicycle, motorized scooter, electric personal assistive mobility device, mobile carrier, personal delivery device, swamp buggy, or moped.
2. **GOLF CART:** A motor vehicle that is designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course for sporting or recreational purposes. A golf cart may be operated on municipal roads that have been designated for such operation by the local municipality. The City of Frostproof Ordinance No. 2019-1 does allow operation on certain roads:

- a) Golf carts may only be operated on roads that have a posted speed limit of 25 miles per hour or less.
- b) Golf carts may cross State or county roads only at such locations that have been specifically designated for golf cart crossings.
- c) Under City Ordinance permitted modification of Florida Law, a golf cart may not be operated on designated public roads by any person under the age of 16.
- d) Florida Statute 316.212 permits nighttime golf cart operation if authorized by the local government, and only if the golf cart is equipped with headlights, brake lights, turn signals, and a windshield. Frostproof City Ordinance No. 2019-1 allows nighttime operation of golf carts on City roads, provided all required equipment is present and functional.
- e) A golf cart, during daylight operation must be equipped with efficient brakes, reliable steering apparatus and safe tires.
- f) Golf carts are not permitted to drive on State or County roads except in such locations as are specifically permitted for purposes of crossing such roads. In addition, golf carts are not permitted to operate on City of Frostproof roads which have posted speed limits higher than 25 miles per hour or which have excessive traffic. A golf cart may cross those roads at a designated golf cart crossing.

D. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS: (For Informational Purposes)

Unlicensed transportation vehicles (examples such as ATV, UTV, Side by Sides, skate boards, hoverboards, Segway, scooters, etc.) except City owned vehicles, may not be used on State, County or City roads including sidewalks and trails.

Rules of Traffic

The Florida Driver's Handbook rules apply to both automobile and golf cart operators.

CAUTION: VIOLATING FLORIDA STATUTES 316.212, 316.2125, OR OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE FLORIDA STATUTES MAY RESULT IN BEING ISSUED A TRAFFIC CITATION.

Traffic Lanes

Always drive on the right side of the road except in those rare cases when you might be passing a bicyclist, parked car, or special direction by legal entities. A golf cart, being a slow vehicle, must stay in the right lane unless passing or turning left.

Making Turns

You must use hand signals or directional signals to show that you are about to turn. Turning a corner may seem to be a simple operation, but many traffic crashes are caused by drivers who do not turn correctly. There are nine (9) steps in making a good turn:

1. Make up your mind about your turn before you get to the turning point. Never make "last-minute" turns.
2. Look behind and to both sides to see where other vehicles are if you must change lanes before making your turn. Use your turn signal before changing lanes also.
3. Move into the correct lane as you near the intersection. The correct lane for the right turn is the lane next to the right edge of the roadway. On a two-lane road with traffic in both directions, an approach for a left turn should be made in the part of the right half of the roadway nearest the centerline.
4. Give a turn indication for at least the last 100 feet before you make your turn. Let other drivers know what you are going to do.
5. Slow down to a safe turning speed.
6. When you are slowing to make a right turn, the bicyclist you passed may be catching up to you. Search over your shoulder before turning. Yield to bicyclists and pedestrians.
7. When turning left, you may be crossing the path of a vehicle, pedestrian or bicyclist. Always search before starting your turn.
8. Make the turn, staying in the proper lane. Yield the right-of-way to any vehicle coming from the opposite direction.
9. Finish your turn in the proper lane. A right turn should be from the right lane into the right lane of the roadway entered. A left turn may be completed in any lane lawfully available, or safe, for the desired direction of travel.

Night Driving

Florida Statute 316.212 permits nighttime golf cart operation if authorized by the local government, and only if the golf cart is equipped with headlights, brake lights, turn signals, and a windshield. Frostproof City Ordinance No. 2019-1 allows nighttime operation of golf carts on City roads, provided all required equipment is present and functional.

Emergency Vehicles

Golf cart drivers must yield the right-of-way to law enforcement personnel cars, fire engines and other emergency vehicles using sirens and/or flashing lights.

Open Intersections

An open intersection is one without traffic control signs or signals. When you enter one, you must yield the right-of-way if:

1. A vehicle is already in the intersection
2. You enter or cross a state highway from a secondary road
3. You enter a paved road from an unpaved road
4. You plan to make a left turn and a vehicle is approaching from the opposite direction
5. When two cars enter an open intersection at the same time, the driver on the left must yield to the driver on the right.

Speeding

Golf carts are not known for their racing qualities. Electric golf carts with their fixed battery and electric motor combination, seldom can reach more than about twelve (12) miles per hour. Over smooth and level roadways, progress at this speed can seem agonizingly slow. So, some golf cart owners may attempt to boost speed with lower gear ratios, altered motor field strength, and higher horsepower ratings to get the golf carts to go faster. The result has been the achievement of speeds over twenty-five (25) miles per hour. **However, per the Florida Statutes and City Ordinance No. 2019-1, the maximum allowable golf cart speed is twenty (20 mph).**

Children Drivers

Children, under the age of 16, are not allowed to drive golf carts on City of Frostproof roads even when accompanied by an adult.

Passenger Safety Tips

Passengers and drivers should always keep their feet inside the golf cart while it is in motion. There is a tendency to leave a leg or foot outside of the cart while it is in motion. Many serious injuries are reported from unexpectedly catching on the ground or a stationary object. Moreover, passengers should have both feet planted firmly on the floor while the golf cart is moving. For extra stability, a passenger should sit with his right hip against the right arm of the seat.

Pedestrians and Bicyclists

It is the driver's responsibility to do everything possible to avoid colliding with any pedestrians, bicyclist or other person. All motorists must yield to bicyclists and pedestrians utilizing the sidewalk. At any non-signalized intersection, marked mid-block crossing or driveway, motorists must yield to pedestrians wishing to cross the road or driveway. At signalized intersections, before making any turn, motorists must yield to pedestrians and bicyclists.

Vehicle Maintenance

Regardless of how well you drive, you are not safe unless your golf cart is in good operating condition. You should regularly check for safe operation of brakes, lights (if so equipped), steering, turn signals (if so equipped) and tires. You should also make sure your batteries are charged to good operating levels. A faulty symptom such as loose holding brakes, wheel wobble or unstable steering should prompt the immediate attention of a mechanic.

Common Sense Applies

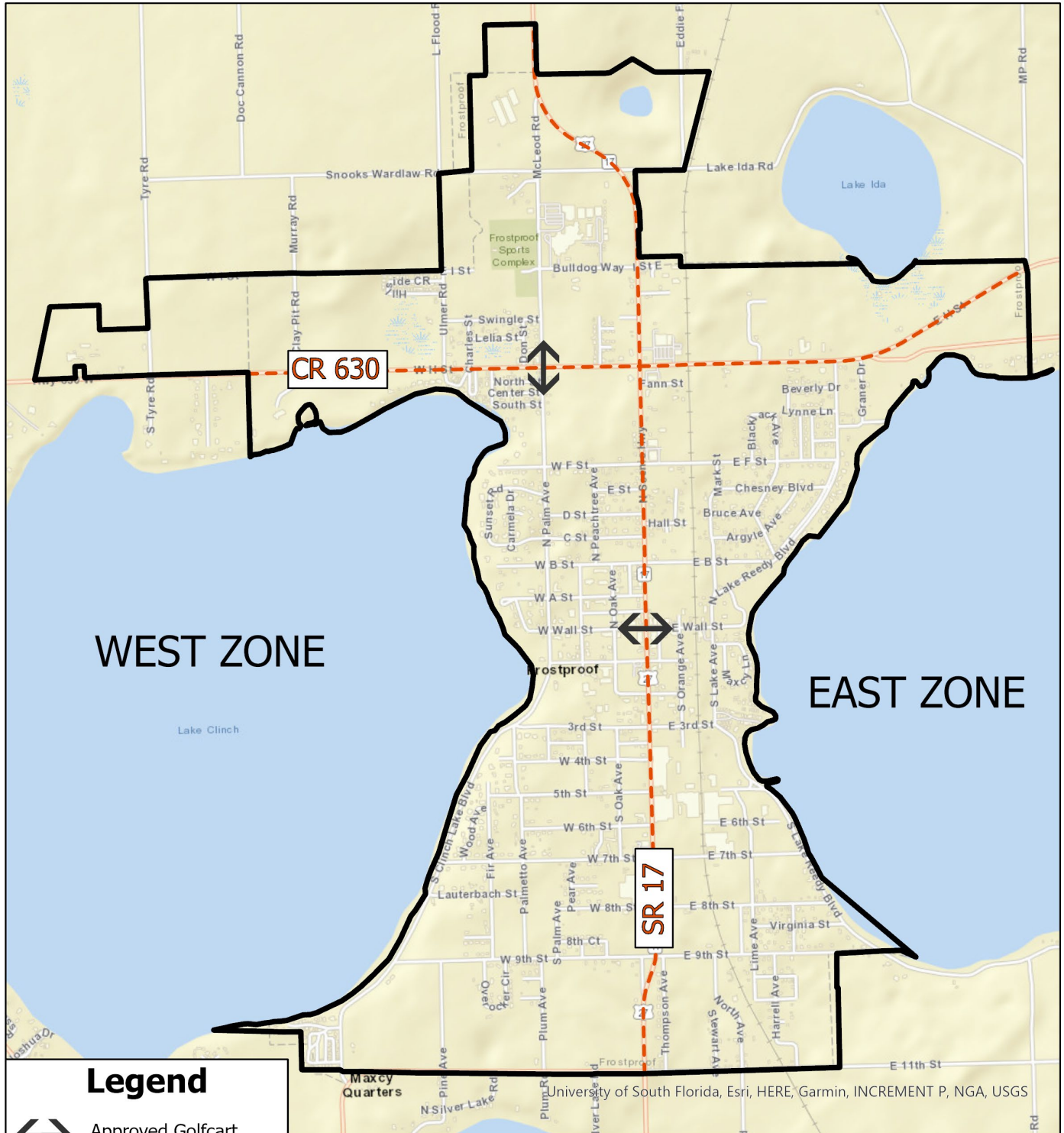
Golf cart drivers must comply with driving laws and all rules of common sense. Never move your golf cart until you have looked in front, behind and to the side for pedestrians and oncoming traffic. Then, signal and pull into traffic when safe.

Driving is a Full Time Job Concentration is one of the most important elements of safe driving. The driver's seat is no place for daydreaming, mental napping, window shopping, scenic viewing or distracting conversation (including cell phone usage and texting).

Ordinance 2019-1

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FROSTPROOF, FLORIDA; CREATING CHAPTER 24, GOLF CARTS, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF FROSTPROOF, FLORIDA; AUTHORIZING GOLF CART OPERATION ON DESIGNATED CITY AND STATE ROADS; PROVIDING FOR LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS; PROVIDING PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, citizens of the City of Frostproof ("City") have expressed a desire to operate golf carts under Florida law within the City limits: and

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of allowing the operation of golf carts on certain City roads adjacent to State and County Roads in such locations and under such conditions which ensure that such operation can be done safely and will not interfere with motorists, bicyclists or pedestrians; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to adopt certain regulations pertaining to unlicensed drivers which are more restrictive than those set forth in state statute as provided for in the statute; and

WHEREAS, the City otherwise desires to avail itself of the opportunity to designate certain City roads for the use of golf carts as more particularly provided for in Florida Statutes; and,

WHEREAS, the City has developed these operation rules and designations concerning golf carts within the corporate limits of the City of Frostproof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FROSTPROOF, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. CREATION OF SECTION 24 OF THE CODE OF

ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FROSTPROOF, FLORIDA.

Section 24, Code of Ordinances, City of Frostproof, Florida (hereafter "Code of Ordinances"), is hereby created to read as follows:

Purpose and Intent.

It is the purpose and intent of this Ordinance to implement procedures and regulations relating to golf cart operation on public roads which are more restrictive than those contained in Chapter 316, Florida Statutes, to protect the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Frostproof.

SECTION 2. CREATION OF SECTION 24, CODE OF ORDINANCES.

Section 24-1, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-1. - Legislative Findings.

The above recitals represent the legislative findings of the City of Frostproof, Florida relative to the provisions of this Ordinance and are incorporated herein by reference. In addition, The City of Frostproof Golf Cart Manual prepared by George F. Young, Inc., dated as of January 12, 2019, as amended from time to time, is incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 3. CREATION OF SECTION 24-2, CODE OF ORDINANCES.

Section 24-2, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-2. - Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter the following definitions shall be applicable hereto in interpreting the meaning of this chapter:

(1) Golf cart shall mean a motor vehicle that is designed and

manufactured for operation on a golf course or for sporting or recreational

purposes and that is not capable of exceeding speeds of 20 miles per hour as defined in Section 320.01(22). Florida Statutes.

(2) "State Road" shall mean any road which is part of the state highway system in Florida Statutes

(3) "County road" shall mean any road which is part of the County Road System as defined in Florida Statutes. The County roads which may be utilized by golf carts are identified in the City of Frostproof Golf Cart Manual

(4) "City road" shall mean any local or collector road within the corporate limits of the City of Frostproof and which is not part of the County Road System or State Road System as defined in Florida Statutes. The City roads which may be utilized by golf carts are identified in the City of Frostproof Golf Cart Manual.

(5) Driver means the person driving and having physical control over the golf cart.

(6) Owner means the person holding the bill of sale to the golf cart and authorized to operate the golf cart with the City of Frostproof."

SECTION 4. CREATION OF SECTION 24-3. CODE OF ORDINANCES.

Section 24-3, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-3. - City Roads Designated for Golf Cart Driving.

The City hereby designates all City roads within the City limits, as amended from time to time, for operation of golf carts. Golf carts may operate on City roads. Furthermore, Golf Carts may not cross a county or state

road except at locations which have been specifically designated and posted for such by Polk County or the Florida Department of Transportation. The City of Frostproof Golf Cart Manual identifies the roads which may be utilized by golf carts and includes a map depicting roads where golf carts may not be utilized.

SECTION 5. CREATION OF SECTION 24-4. CODE OF ORDINANCES.

Section 24-4, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-4. - Operation of Golf Carts.

(1) The operation of a golf cart upon City roads is prohibited unless the golf cart is operated and equipped in full compliance with F. S. §316.212 and all applicable provisions of the City Code of Ordinances.

(2) In addition to the requirements of F.S. §316.212, which are applicable to the operation of golf carts, the following restrictions shall also apply to the operation of golf carts on City roads.

(a) Golf carts must be properly equipped in compliance with this Ordinance. Golf carts operated on City roads between sunrise and sunset ("daylight operation") shall be equipped with efficient brakes, reliable steering apparatus, safe tires, a rearview mirror and red reflectorized warning devices in both the front and rear. Golf carts operated on City roads between sunset and sunrise ("24-hour operation") shall, in addition to the equipment required for daylight operation, be equipped with headlights, brake lights, turn signals and a windshield.

(b) A golf cart having the equipment required for daylight operation may be operated on designated roads during daylight hours only

between sunrise and sunset. A golf cart having the equipment required for 24-hour operation may operate at any time of the day or night.

(c) Golf carts may not be operated on any designated public roads by anyone under the age of sixteen 16 years. Drivers of golf carts on City roads must have in their possession a valid driver's license.

(d) Every driver of a golf cart on City roads must, while transporting a child under the age of six, provide for the protection of the child by placing the child in and properly using a federally approved child restraint device.

(e) Drivers of golf carts on City roads must observe state and local traffic laws applicable to motor vehicles.

(f) It is unlawful to operate a golf cart on any City sidewalks, rights-of-way, or any other location in which a motor vehicle is prohibited as proscribed by State Statute or City Ordinance.

(g) Golf Carts may not carry more passengers than the maximum number for which the Golf Cart was designed. Generally, this will allow for no more than two (2) passengers per bench seat.

SECTION 6. CREATION OF SECTION 24-5, CODE OF ORDINANCES.

Section 24-5, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-5. Signage Requirements.

The City shall post signage which satisfies the requirements of Florida Statutes on all City roads designated for Golf Cart operation.

SECTION 7. CREATION OF SECTION 24-6, CODE OF ORDINANCES.

Section 24-6, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-6. – Revocable License: Waiver of Liability.

(1) The operation of golf carts on City roads shall be deemed to be a License for use of those roads revocable upon the will of the City Council in its legislative capacity based on its consideration of the health, safety and welfare of the public arising from such use. This Ordinance shall not limit or otherwise preclude the City Council from amendment or revocation of this Ordinance, or contracting or expanding the roads on which golf carts can be operated.

(2) All persons operating golf carts on City roads shall do so on the condition that there shall be no claim made against the City for any monetary loss or other claims for any loss by allowing golf cart operation on City roads or any monetary loss therefor based on a claim against the City in reliance on the provisions of this Section.

SECTION 8. CREATION OF SECTION 24-7. CODE OF

ORDINANCES. Section 24-7, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-7. - Waiver of Claim.

Any person operating a golf cart on City roads and all persons who are passengers in such golf carts shall be deemed to have waived any claim against the City for its legislative decision to allow the operation of such golf carts on City roads as permitted hereby.

SECTION 9. CREATION OF SECTION 24-8. CODE OF

ORDINANCES. Section 24-8, Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read as follows:

24-8. - Violations.

Violations of this article shall be enforced pursuant to the procedures established by section 1-10, Code of Ordinances, and in accordance with the provisions of Chapters 162. 316 and 162.318. Florida Statutes, by law enforcement officers and code compliance officers as their legal authority and jurisdiction allow.

SECTION 10. CODIFICATION. Sections 1 through 9, inclusive, of this Ordinance shall be codified and incorporated into the Code of Ordinances as Sections 24-1 through 24-8, Chapter 24, said article to be entitled "Golf Carts."

SECTION 11. CONFLICTS. All ordinances or resolutions in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed,

SECTION 12. SEVERABILITY. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, that holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the City Council.
